Universal Dock adapter connection

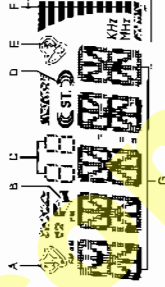
(Dock adapter not included)



1. Fix the two nails (Size 3.5*25BA) into the wall and they should parallel each other. (The distance between the two nails should be 140 mm)
2. Please hang the main unit on the wall as showed by picture 2.

Note: Screws are not included

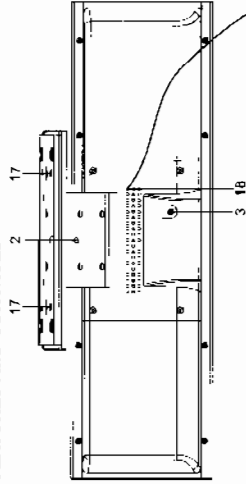

PUTTING THE BATTERY INTO THE REMOTE CONTROL UNIT

1. Press down on the compartment cover, and slide the cover off open the compartment
2. Place the battery (CR2032) into the battery compartment according to the polarity marking with the "+" sign facing up.
3. Place the cover over the compartment, press down lightly, and push it upward until it snaps on.

Note: Remove the battery from the remote control if not in used for a long period of time. Do not mix normal batteries with rechargeable batteries. When the batteries become weak, remote control will not function. Replace the batteries.

POWER CORD CONNECTION

1. Connect the AC/DC Adaptor Plug to the DC jack on the right side of the unit.
2. Connect the AC/DC Adaptor Plug to the AC outlet socket.
- Note: 1. To start, connect the DC jack of external adaptor to the socket behind the main unit, then connect the AC plug to the main docked whilst the unit is in standby mode.
2. To avoid damage to the unit and/or your iPod device, the iPod device must be docked whilst the unit is in standby mode.

OPERATING THE UNIT

When you first plug the AC/DC Adaptor plug into the AC outlet socket, the unit will be in standby mode. You can press the STANDBY/ON button on the unit (or on the remote control) to switch the unit ON or OFF. Pull the AC/DC Adaptor plug out of the wall socket if you want to switch the unit off completely. Note: When the unit is in STANDBY mode, you can also press the FUNCTION button to switch the unit "ON". Switch off the unit by pressing the STANDBY button only.

POWER/STANDBY

1. Press the STANDBY/ON button on the unit (or remote control) to switch the unit on. The red STANDBY indicator will switch off.
 2. Select the sound source (iPod, AUX or Tuner) by pressing the FUNCTION button.
 3. Adjust the volume with the VOLUME (UP or DOWN) button.
 4. Set the preset equalizer (PASS, CLASSIC, ROCK, POP or JAZZ) with the EQ button on the unit (or remote control).
 5. Press the STANDBY button again to turn off the unit. The red STANDBY indicator will switch on.
- Note: 1. When the unit is in iPod mode, if there is no iPod Player on the iPod dock bracket, the main unit will automatically switch off after 15 minutes.

CLOCK SETTING

During the unit in STANDBY mode

1. Press the CLOCK button to select the 12-hour or 24-hour.
2. Press and hold the CLOCK button, the HOUR digit will flash. Press the SKIP/SEARCH (DOWN or UP) button to adjust HOUR digit. Press the CLOCK button again, the MINUTE digit will also flash. Press the SKIP/SEARCH (DOWN or UP) button to adjust MINUTE digit.
3. Press the CLOCK button to confirm the time.

Note: If no action is taken for 10 seconds during this process, the system will reset and you must start again.

FUNCTION SELECT

Press the FUNCTION button to change the sound source. The display window will change as below

IPod → AUX

AUX INPUT

1. The AUX input is located at the rear of the unit. Use a 3.5mm stereo jack cable to connect audio equipment through the 1 INF IN jack.
2. To select the AUX function, repeatedly press the FUNCTION button on the unit (or remote control) until the AUX indicator is on the display window.
3. Press the VOLUME (UP or DOWN) button to adjust the sound output level.

Note: LINE in cable not included.

EQ CONTROL (on the remote control)

EQ shows the present sound tone. When you press the EQ button on the remote control, the sound tone changes as below

PASS → CLASSIC → ROCK → POP → JAZZ

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TO SET SLEEP FUNCTION (on the remote control)

1. If you want to fall asleep to music, press the SLEEP button on the remote control.
2. You may adjust the iPod, AUX or TUNER sleep function to play to play between 1 and 90 minutes of music before the system shuts itself down automatically.

MUTE SETTING (on the remote control)

1. When you press the MUTE button once on the remote control, the audio output will be temporarily terminated. The MUTE and the VOLUME LEVEL indicators will flash a few seconds and the unit will return to its original display. The VOLUME LEVEL indicator will continue to flash. (F1)
2. Press the MUTE button again, both the volume level and the audio output will return to normal. (F2)

ALARM CLOCK OPERATION (on the remote control)

When the unit is in STANDBY mode

1. Press the "ALARM 1" SET/OFF button once on the remote control. The "AL 1 BELL SYMBOL" indicator will light on. Press the "ALARM 1" SET/OFF button one more time and hold it for a few seconds, then the "HOUR" indicator will flash. Adjust to the correct "HOUR" by pressing the "SKIP/TUNE SEARCH (UP or DOWN)" button.
2. Press the "ALARM 1" SET/OFF button again. The "MINUTE" indicator will flash. Adjust to the correct "MINUTE" by pressing the "SKIP/TUNE SEARCH (UP or DOWN)" button.
3. Press the "ALARM 1" SET/OFF button again to display the ALARM modes (TUNER, iPod or BUZZER). Select your preferred alarm mode by pressing the "SKIP/TUNE SEARCH" (icon for Skip or icon for Search) button on your remote control.
4. Press the "ALARM 1" SET/OFF button repeatedly to confirm the "ALARM 1" function, the "HOUR/MINUTE" indicator will flash and switch to "CLOCK", and then the "AL 1 BELL SYMBOL" indicator will light on the LCD display.

To set "ALARM 2"

1. Press the "ALARM 2" SET/OFF button once on the remote control. The "AL 2 BELL SYMBOL" indicator will light on and the "HOUR" indicator will flash. Adjust to the correct "HOUR" by pressing the "SKIP/TUNE SEARCH (UP or DOWN)" button.
2. Press the "ALARM 2" SET/OFF button. The "MINUTE" indicator will flash. Adjust to the correct "MINUTE" by pressing the "SKIP/TUNE SEARCH (UP or DOWN)" button.
3. Press the "ALARM 2" SET/OFF button again to display the ALARM modes (TUNER, iPod or BUZZER). Select your preferred alarm mode by pressing the "SKIP/TUNE SEARCH" (icon for Skip or icon for Search) button on your remote control.
4. Press the "ALARM 2" SET/OFF button repeatedly to confirm the "ALARM 2" function, the "HOUR/MINUTE" indicator will flash and change to "CLOCK", and then the "AL 2 BELL SYMBOL" indicator will light on the LCD display.

IPod OPERATION

When the unit is in STANDBY mode:

1. Insert the iPod device into the iPod dock connector.
2. Power on the unit and then press the FUNCTION button to iPod mode, the iPod LED indicator will flash. The iPod indicator will appear on the unit display. (F3)

When the unit is in iPod mode:

1. Press the PLAY/PAUSE button once to start the iPod playing. Adjust the volume level by pressing the VOLUME (UP or DOWN) button.
2. Press the PLAY/PAUSE button once to pause the current track. To resume the playback, press the PLAY/PAUSE button once again.
3. To skip forwards or backwards, press the SKIP/TUNE SEARCH (UP or DOWN) button to select the desired track.

4. Press the REPEAT/MONO/STEREO button to make the iPod a track repeatedly.

Note: iPod touch version 1.1.2 or above can support REPEAT function only.

How to select the iPod Menu mode:

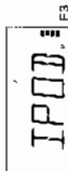
1. When the unit is in iPod mode, press the MENU button on the remote control and the unit will enter the iPod MENU function.
2. Press the PRESET/ARROW (UP or DOWN) button to select from the menu list as following: Music > Extras > Photo Import (does not display on the display on the iPod) > Settings > Shuffle Songs > Backlight > Now Playing. These options will show on the iPod's display screen.
3. Press the SELECT button once on the remote control to select the desired menu folder.
4. Press the PRESET/ARROW (UP or DOWN) button again to search the content in each desired menu folder.
5. You can always return to the previous menu by pressing the MENU button.

Charging the iPod Player battery through the main unit:

1. iPod has an internal nonremovable battery, you may need to charge it if it has not been used for awhile.
 2. You can charge the iPod through the main unit automatically under the STANDBY or POWER ON mode.
- Note: 1. The iPod's battery is 80-percent charged in about an hour, and fully charged in about a few hours. If you charge it while playing music, it may take longer.

2. It is better not charge under the TUNER mode. It may interfere that the reception is at its best.

1. At any time, you can control the iPod via the remote control while the unit is in "iPod" or "iPod MENU" mode.
2. To avoid damage to iPod devices and/or the main unit, the iPod device must be docked while the unit is in STANDBY mode.



SNOOZE FUNCTION

Press the SNOOZE button after the TUNER, iPod or BUZZER alarm has sounded. The alarm will switch off and will come on again in approximately 5 minutes. You may repeat this cycle several times during the 1-hour alarm period.

NOTE: 1. When the bell is ringing, you can press the "STANDBY" button once or press the "ALARM 1 SET/OFF or ALARM 2 SET/OFF" button once on the remote control to stop the "ALARM 1 or 2" function. The "AL 1 or 2 BELL SYMBOL" indicator will still light on the LCD display. (Your set alarm time will remain for the following day when you use this function.)

2. When the bell is not ringing, if you want to stop the "ALARM 1 or 2" function fully, you can press the "ALARM 1 SET/OFF or ALARM 2 SET/OFF" button once on the remote control only. The "AL 1 or 2 BELL SYMBOL" indicator will turn off on the display. The function of the "ALARM 1 or 2" will cancel.
3. When the alarm is activated under the iPod or tuner mode, the volume can be adjusted.

RADIO OPERATION

1. Press the FUNCTION button to select TUNER mode on the unit (or remote control).
2. Select the desired frequency with the SKIP/TUNE SEARCH (UP or DOWN) button. Press continuously until you read the correct frequency or the reception is at its best.

Mono/Stereo Select

This unit can receive FM mode only.

1. When you want to select FM stereo station, press the REPEAT/MONO/STEREO button on the remote control.
2. When you receive a FM stereo station the "STEREO" indicator will appear on the display window, this means you are receiving FM transmission in stereo.
3. When you press the REPEAT/MONO/STEREO button again, the FM STEREO indicator will turn off and the unit will switch to FM MONO status.

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Automatic Tuning

1. Press the SKIP/TUNE SEARCH (UP or DOWN) button for a few seconds, then release the button. The tuner will automatically search to the first station of sufficient signal strength.
2. Repeat the above procedure if you wish to select another station.

Programming preset stations

You can preset stations of your choice and store up 20 FM stations in the unit's memory. To store your selected broadcasting stations

1. When the unit is in TUNER mode, press the SKIP/TUNE SEARCH (UP or DOWN) button to search for the required station.
2. Press the MEMORY button on the remote control.
3. Press the PRESET/ARROW (+ or -) button on the remote control for your desired station channel.
4. Press the MEMORY button again to confirm your selection.
5. To program more stations into memory, repeat the above steps 1 to 4.

Note: To change the stored preset stations, repeat the above steps 1 to 4.

1. Storing a new station into a preset location will erase the station previously stored in that location.
2. Power off failure or power cord disconnection will clear the memory of all preset stations. Perform the station presetting procedures again to store the stations.

Selecting the Preset Stations

1. Press the PRESET/ARROW (UP or DOWN) button to select the desired preset station number.
2. The numeric location of that preset station is displayed along with the corresponding frequency.

FM Antenna

Make sure the FM antenna is extended to its full length. It may be necessary to vary the direction of this antenna wire until you find the position that provides the best reception for your favorite FM stations.
